DARS AWARDS CONTRACTS FOR PROGRAMS SERVING INDIVIDUALS WITH BRAIN INJURIES

(RICHMOND, Va.) —The Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services has awarded contracts beginning this month through June 2014 for programs on the Eastern Shore and in Virginia Beach that serve people with brain injuries.

No Limits Eastern Shore Inc., located in Onancock, won a \$235,806 contract to operate a day program for adults with acquired brain injury. The No Limits day program is open four days a week and serves about 20 participants. No Limits, nolimitseasternshore.com, first opened in 2001 in Belle Haven as a division of Commonwealth Support Systems and moved to Onancock in 2008.

The \$300,222 contract to operate Beacon House, a Virginia Beach clubhouse program for individuals with acquired brain injury, was awarded to Eggleston Services. Beacon House, which serves 42 active members, is one of six state-funded clubhouse programs providing “peer to peer” environments in Virginia for people with brain injury. Norfolk-based Eggleston Services, www.egglestonservices.org, operates 26 programs in 13 locations.

Through its Brain Injury Services Coordination Unit, DARS manages programs, contracts and federal grants involving brain injury services throughout the Commonwealth.
